Emergency Management Plans and Doctrine

Project Manager, Port of Oakland, Emergency Communications Plan, Port of Oakland, Oakland, CA, 2014 – Current:

Leading a team to develop a Port-wide emergency communications plan to coordinate incident information exchange between the seaport, airport and commercial real estate divisions. The project requires producing a matrix of information requirements and describing systems for information flow. Additionally, the project objectives include evaluating and improving employee, tenant vendor and public notification processes.

Project Manager, City of San Jose, Department of Transportation Emergency Action Plan, San Jose, CA 2013 -2014:

Led his staff to design and deliver a new all hazards emergency action plan. The plan addressed collecting post incident information to develop situational awareness mechanism for sharing a common operating picture with staff and outside agency stakeholders. Additionally the Plan addressed debris management operations, compliance with the FEMA Public Assistance Program and infrastructure inspections and recording.

Project Manager, RCPGP Bay Area Catastrophic Earthquake Response Plans, Bay Area UASI, San Francisco, CA, 2009-2013:

Led multi discipline teams to develop and validate 59 local and 8 regional catastrophic response plans for eight functional areas. This project includes over 20 staff and multiple sub-contractors. The planning area includes 12 counties in the Bay Area region and the cities of Oakland and San Jose.

Project Manager, Emergency Operations Plan Revision, Dublin, CA, 2011-2012

Led a team that revised the Alameda Operational Area EOP. The new EOP complied with SEMS/ICS and provide substantially more operational guidance than the existing EOP. The resulting EOP consolidated several overlapping and inconsistent plans and met all requirements of Cal EMA and FEMA Guidance. It received final approval and adoption by the County Board of Supervisors in 2013.

Disaster Response Operations

Project Manager, Southern California Fires, Post Fire Erosion Control, FEMA Region IX, Multi-Agency Support Group, FEMA, Colton, CA, 2007:

Led a multiple agency group coordinating State of California and Federal efforts to evaluate potential erosion impacts due to post-fire debris flows and flooding after the 2007 Southern California Fires. He led development of hazard awareness mapping products, analyzed agency roles, responsibilities and authorities and coordinated post-fire erosion control project implementation across agency and jurisdictional lines. During this effort, he worked closely with CALFIRES, California Geological Service, DWR and OES to analyze debris hazards and recommend mitigation actions to protect life and property and prevent post fire debris from presenting a public hazard.

Federal Coordinating Officer, Missouri and Nebraska Spring Floods, FEMA Region VII, Kansas City, MO, 2007:

Served as the Senior Federal Official designated with Disaster Recovery Manager Authority to execute the full range of Stafford Act recovery programs for a combined total of 5 disasters in Missouri and Nebraska. He oversaw implementation of Individual and Public Assistance, and Hazard Mitigation programs, and advised State emergency management officials on the Public Assistance Pilot Program and on Enhanced Hazard Mitigation Program requirements.
